When planning, it's best to be aware that something may happen that derails, or destroys your best laid plans.

Here's some sound advice:

Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, and spend a year there and engage in business and make a profit." Yet you do not know what your life will be like tomorrow. You are just a vapor that appears for a little while and then vanishes away. Instead, you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we will live and also do this or that."

# **REMEMBER** SP NEVER FORGET

Some things we need to remember!

"In everything I showed you that by working hard in this manner you must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He Himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'"

Acts 20:35

#### 'HELP THE WEAK'

**Weak** (Greek: *astheneh'-o*): to be feeble (lacking strength, vigor in any sense).

Remember that helping others benefits both the giver and the one helped. And it is pleasing to our Lord. It's a win-win-win activity.

Anyone who has helped the weak can testify of the satisfying feeling one receives. A case in point: A young woman, who was depressed and had little self-esteem, was advised reach out and help someone in need. She did, and later exclaimed," I never felt so good about myself."

#### **ADMONITION**

Now we who are strong ought to bear the weaknesses of those without strength and not just please ourselves. Each of us is to please his neighbor for his good, to his edification. Romans 15:1-2

Let's put our faith to work by remembering to help those who are weak physically, weak spiritually, weak in faith, or weak in any sense.

#### **STOP SIGNS**

Two very true statements: (1) Stop signs don't stop cars. (2) God's laws don't stop sin.

Laws are not designed to stop lawlessness. They only specify what is forbidden. It's the driver who either obeys or disobeys stop signs. And it's the individual who obeys or disobeys God's commandments.

The driver must deal with the consequences of disobeying stop signs. And the individual must deal with the eternal consequences of disobeying God's "stop signs."

Ignoring a stop sign may not always result in a serious consequence, but disobeying God's commandments will certainly incur consequences. Sometimes in this life, but definitely in the judgment.

For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may be recompensed for his deeds in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad.
