"Blessed are you when men hate you, and ostracize you, and insult you, and scorn your name as evil, for the sake of the Son of Man." Luke 6:22


BE ADVISED

In the past few years there has been much controversy over the posting of the 10 Commandments in public places. Those commandments were originally given to the Israelites by Moses years ago. Be alert so as to deflect the overpowering influence of others.

Be on the alert, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong. 1 Corinthians 16:13

We must not think that our influence will always overpower that of others.

"Or what king, when he sets out to meet another king in battle, will not first sit down and take counsel whether he is strong enough with ten thousand men to encounter the one coming against him with twenty thousand?" Luke 14:31

There are those who will mistreat Christians.
