The Book of Revelation

"The book of Revelation seems to provoke two responses; obsession or terror. For some, the book is a playground they can never leave, as they find speculative theories about the end of the world and Christ's second coming. At the other extreme are those so afraid of Revelation's signs and symbols that they decide to avoid the book entirely."

Revelation is the only book in the New Testament that is mainly prophetic, which makes it unique. The first few chapters are not too difficult to understand. But what is found in the remainder of the book is difficult to grasp.

What is most familiar to many people are: 1,000-year reign, 144,000, four horsemen of the apocalypse, 666, Armageddon (Har-mageddon), Beast, Lake of fire, Lamb of God, new heaven and earth. Without a clear understanding of the time of writing, the structure, the context, and the symbolism, it's difficult to know what they represent.

One does not need to fully comprehend the book of Revelation to be a disciple. The first converts became disciples years before it was written. All can agree that it was written to encourage the followers of the Lamb to remain faithful during trials and persecution. And that the final outcome is "Jesus wins" and his followers obtain the promised reward. Revelation can be helpful when properly understood. But, unfortunately, it has become the seed bed for fanciful scenarios of the "last days."

To understand the Revelation letter, it's helpful to:

- Be familiar with the book by reading it.
- Know the structure of the book. Be aware of the error of separating a verse (or verses) from the context. Ignore chapter breaks and verse numbering.
- Be patient when studying it.

NOTE

• Have an understanding of apocalyptic literature. There are several books available. One is Mark Roberts book, *Understanding Apocalyptic Literature*.

On pages 2-3, the **Outline of Revelation** is brief on purpose. It enables one to see the different parts as they appear in the context. It helps to view the book as a whole before dissecting it.
