HOW

MEMORIALS

In Washington DC, there are monuments dedicated to individuals, such as George Washington, Abraham Lincoln, Thomas Jefferson, and others. But one memorial is most impressive: the Vietnam War Memorial Wall. It is a wall with over 58,000 names of dead and missing soldiers who died while serving their country. These are the names of those who gave the ultimate sacrificial gift.

While visiting the memorial, I observed someone looking for the name of a loved one. Once found, he began tracing the name onto a piece of paper. What an emotional moment. What an act of appreciation. What a moving demonstration of love.

But that memorial with all those names pales by comparison to another name that was inscribed years ago. That name was inscribed, not on a wall, not on a monument, and not on a headstone. It was written on a cross—in Hebrew, Greek, and Latin—for all to read: "JESUS THE NAZARENE, THE KING OF THE JEWS." Jesus, God's only Son, who took on the form of man to become the sacrificial Lamb that takes away the sins of the world.

Jesus died. No! He was crucified! He gave His life that you and I might be reconciled to God. It was a dreadful sight: Nailed to a cross between two thieves. Bystanders mocking. His mother watching. What agony. What excruciating pain. But most of all, what love. Love for all mankind.

CALVARY (Golgotha)*

That wooden cross is gone. The place where He was crucified is uncertain. But before Jesus was crucified, He gave His disciples directions on how to remember His death: And when He had taken some bread and given thanks, He broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in

remembrance of Me." And in the same way He took the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood." Luke 22:19-20.

MAY WE NEVER FORGET

"This do in remembrance of me."

On the first day of the week as His followers we partake of the bread and the fruit of the vine in remembrance of His great sacrifice and His love for you and me. What a solemn occasion. What an act of appreciation. What a moving demonstration of love!

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Golgotha– The name of the place where Jesus was crucified. It is interpreted by Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, as meaning "the place of a skull." This name represents in Greek letters the Aramaic word *Gulgaltha*.

Calvary is not found in the Greek text. It is derived from the Latin word for skull, Calvarius. Most all of today's translations do not contain the word.

Be On Guard (1)

AN AGE-OLD PROBLEM

Misunderstanding

Misusing

Misquoting

FOUR WAYS IN WHICH SCRIPTURES ARE HANDLED

Sincerely, but misunderstood.

Diligently, but for support of pre-conceived beliefs.

The desire to create support for beliefs gives birth to "proof-texting." (*The basis for the saying, "You can prove anything by the Bible."*)

Abused (dishonest, self-deluded) knowingly misuse and twist Scriptures.

Honest and sincere inquiry; wherein one is willing to accept what is written (setting aside previously held beliefs or notions).



Love

It's easier to love humanity as a whole than to love those we encounter on a daily basis.

If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for the one who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen.

Love is the glue that holds relationships together; jealously causes them to become unstuck.

Love is patient, love is kind, and is not jealous; love does not brag and is not arrogant, does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own, is not provoked, does not take into account a wrong suffered.

HYPERBOLE

A figure of speech in which exaggeration is used for emphasis or effect.

Through the Eye of a Needle

"Again I say to you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle, than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." When the disciples heard this, they were very astonished and said,

"Then who can be saved?"

Matthew 19:24-25

The preceding verses (16-23) mention a young rich ruler who said, "All these things [the commandments] I have kept; what am I still lacking?" He went away sorrowful, being unwilling to part with his treasures for "treasures in heaven."

The contrast between the small size of the needle's eye and the largest indigenous animal is to be preserved for its very improbability. Jesus' hearers believed that wealth and prosperity were a sign of God's blessing (cf. Leviticus and Deuteronomy). So their disbelief is more along the lines that, "if the rich, who must be seen as righteous by God by their evident blessing, can't be saved, who can be?"
