He who is slow to anger is better than the mighty, And he who rules his spirit, than he who captures a city.

Proverbs 16:32

A man's discretion makes him slow to anger, And it is his glory to overlook a transgression. Proverbs 19:11

BE LIKE HIM

The LORD is compassionate and gracious, Slow to anger and abounding in lovingkindness. Psalm 103:8



NEIGHBORS

- 3:27-28 Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to do it. Do not say to your neighbor, "Go, and come back, and tomorrow I will give it," When you have it with you.
- 11:24-26 There is one who scatters, yet increases all the more, and there is one who withholds what is justly due, but it results only in want. The generous man will be prosperous, and he who waters will himself be watered. He who withholds grain, the people will curse him, but blessing will be on the head of him who sells it.
- 14:21 He who despises his neighbor sins, but happy is he who is gracious to the poor.
- 19:17 He who is gracious to a poor man lends to the Lord, and He will repay him for his good deed.
- 21:13 He who shuts his ear to the cry of the poor will also cry himself and not be answered.
- 22:9 He who is generous will be blessed, for he gives some of his food to the poor.

But wishing to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" ... [Jesus then asked] "Which of these three do you think proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell into the robbers' hands?" And he said, "The one who showed mercy toward him."
