GIFTS OF THE MAGI

Frankincense (Greek: libanos)

is a vegetable resin, bitter and glittering, obtained by incisions in the bark of the arbor thuris, "the incense tree." It was used as incense at sacrifices, (Exodus 30:7) or for perfume, (Song of Solomon 3:6).

Myrrh (Greek: noun, smurna)

is a gum resin from a shrubby tree. The fruit is smooth and somewhat larger than a pea. The color of myrrh varies from pale reddish-yellow to reddish-brown or red. The taste is bitter, and the substance astringent, acting as an antiseptic and a stimulant. It was used as a perfume (Psalm 45:8), It was one of the ingredients of the "anointing oil" for the priests, (Exodus 30:23); for embalming (John 19:39).

Myrrh (Greek: verb, smurnizo)

is used transitively in the NT, with the meaning "to mingle or drug with myrrh," (Mark 15:23); the mixture was doubtless offered to deaden the pain (Matthew's word "gall" suggests that myrrh was not the only ingredient). Christ refused to partake of any such means of alleviation; He would retain all His mental power for the complete fulfillment of the Father's will.

PERSONAL ID

Personal ID is used to prove you are who you claim to be. Claiming to be someone is not enough.

And claiming to be a Christian is not enough. A Christians is not identified by outward appearance, adornment, social status, religious, church going, etc., but by how the Bible identifies a Christian. A Christian is more than a good moral person. A Christian is identified as one who is a:

DISCIPLE: One who willingly and eagerly embraces the teachings of Jesus.

The disciples were first called Christians in Antioch. Acts 11:26

"My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit, and so prove to be My disciples. John 15:8 One who has obeyed the Gospel.

A disciple who strives to learn and follow his teacher.

SAINT: (Sanctified: Set apart; holy.)

"... To all the saints in Christ Jesus" Philippians 1:1

To the church of God which is at Corinth, to those who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, saints by calling, with all who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. 1 Corinthians 1:2

"If you were of the world, the world would love its own; but because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, because of this the world hates you. John 15:19

One set apart (from the world) unto God.

Living in, but not of, the world.

"One who marches to the beat of a different drummer [Jesus]."

CHILD: Of God.

But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name. John 1:12

For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. Galatians 3:26-27

A member of God's family; sons and daughters of God.

PRIEST: One who offer up sacrifices of praise and thanksgiving.

- "... you also, as living stones, are being built up as a spiritual house for a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. 1 Peter 2:5
- "... and He has made us to be a kingdom, priests to His God and Father--to Him be the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen." Revelation 1:6

One who serve the Lord, offering up spiritual sacrifices.

BRETHREN: Gk: adelphos (brother)

One united by a common calling: common faith, confession, purpose, hope, salvation.)

GOOD QUESTION

TELL AND SHOW

Most parents are aware of a school activity called "Show and Tell." What each Christian needs to be aware of is the activity of "Tell and Show." What do I mean?

Christians need to:

SHOW

others what the new life is all about.
